Sarasota Mayor to Participate in Celebrate Literacy Week, Florida

January 5, 2009 (Sarasota, FL) – Sarasota Mayor Lou Ann Palmer will be teaming up with The Early Learning Coalition (ELC) of Sarasota County to promote early childhood literacy for the children of Sarasota County.

As part of *Celebrate Literacy Week, Florida*, Mayor Palmer will be reading "You're Not My Best Friend Anymore" by Charlotte Pomerantz, aloud to children at Pines of Sarasota Child Care Center on January 14th at 10 a.m. *Celebrate Literacy Week, Florida* is a statewide effort to promote literacy by raising awareness of the programs and projects offered by the Department of Education and its partner agencies, such as The ELC of Sarasota County.

The ELC's participation in *Celebrate Literacy Week, Florida* coincides with the launch of their community awareness campaign to "Eliminate the 30 Million Word Gap," which refers to the huge difference in the number of words a child from a less talkative home would hear by age 3 compared to a child from a more communicative environment. This campaign teaches parents simple things they can do to promote early literacy skills in young children and provides incentives for families who actively participate. The ELC's awareness campaign is part of a community-wide initiative called LEAF (Literacy Empowers All Families). The collaborative effort is funded by a comprehensive, multi-year grant from the Community Foundation of Sarasota County and in addition to the participation of the Early Learning Coalition, involves several other partners including the School Board of Sarasota County, Children First, and the Sarasota County Library System.

The Early Learning Coalition (ELC) of Sarasota County was established in 1999 by Florida legislation. The purpose of the ELC of Sarasota County is to administer and facilitate a number of programs and services designed to support early education efforts that help to ensure Sarasota's Pre-K children (ages 0 - 5) enter school ready to learn.
